

Important documentation

- Passports – make sure the expiry date is well in the future to ensure that you are not travelling on temporary passports
- Unabridged birth certificate – in order to receive a work permit or occupational permit for Mauritius you need an unabridged birth certificate, in either English or French, for each member of your family
- Vaccination records – although these are not a requirement to enter Mauritius it is important to keep children's vaccination records with you, especially if you want to continue their inoculations in Mauritius
- Tax clearance certificate – it is a good to pay a visit to your auditor and make sure that this aspect is under control to prevent any surprises while you are abroad. Find out if what income is taxable while working in Mauritius
- Visas – if you are need a visa to enter Mauritius apply for it well in advance. This can be organized through your nearest Mauritian embassy
- Marriage certificate
- Identity document
- Driver's licence
- Medical and dental records – especially if you have a specific condition
- Academic records, degrees, diplomas and certificates
- Proof of residency – usually a utility bill of the last three months with your personal name and address stated on it
- Investment records
- School records
- Bank records
- A copy of your will
